my academic benchmarks

[Salient points of NMC CBME regulations for MBBS curriculum]

(a) Attendance;

- There shall be a minimum of 75% attendance in theory and 80% in practical /clinical for eligibility to appear for the examinations in each subject.
- In subjects that are taught in more than one phase - the learner must have 75% attendance in theory and 80% in practical in each phase of instruction in that subject.
- The Foundation Course shall have a minimum of 75% attendance of all students mandatorily.
- There shall be minimum of 80% attendance in family visits under Family Adoption Programme. Each student shall adopt minimum 3 (preferably 5) families.
- There must be 75% attendance in Professional Development Programme (AETCOM Module) for eligibility to appear for final examination in each professional year.
- Learners must have at least 75 % attendance in the Electives to appear in Third Professional - Part II examination/NEXT.
- If an examination comprises more than one subject (for e.g., General Surgery and allied branches), the candidate must have a minimum of 75% attendance in each subject including its allied branches, and 80% attendance in each clinical posting.
- If the student's attendance is less than 75% for theory and less than 80% for practical/clinical training, the student cannot appear in the annual as well as the following supplementary examination. Such student is required to take classes with junior batch commencing in the next academic year to compensate for his attendance deficit, especially the course, he has missed. He will be eligible to appear in the examination in the next academic year only.

(b) Internal assessment:

- Regular periodic examinations shall be conducted throughout the course.
- There shall be no less than three internal assessment examinations in each subject of first and second professional year, and no less than two examinations in each subject of final professional year.
- An end of posting clinical assessment shall be conducted for each clinical posting in each professional year.
- Internal assessment shall not be added to summative assessment. Internal assessment marks will reflect as separate head of passing at the summative examination.
- Day to day records and log book (including required skill certifications) should be given importance in internal assessment. Internal assessment should be based on competencies and skills.
- Learners must have completed the required certifiable competencies for that phase of training and completed the log book appropriate for that phase of training to be eligible for appearing at the final university examination of that subject.

- When subjects are taught in more than one phase, the internal assessment must be done in each phase and must contribute proportionately to final assessment. For example, General Medicine must be assessed in second Professional, third Professional Part I and third Professional Part II, independently.
- The final internal assessment in a broad clinical specialty (e.g., Surgery and allied specialties etc.) shall comprise of marks from all the constituent specialties. The proportion of the marks for each constituent specialty shall be determined by the time of instruction allotted to each.
- Learners must secure at least 50% marks of the total marks (combined in theory and practical &/or clinical; not less than 40% marks in theory and practical separately) for internal assessment in a particular subject in order to be eligible for appearing at the final University examination of that subject.

(c) Summative university assessment

- A candidate shall obtain a minimum of 40% marks separately in Theory and in Practical (Practical includes: practical/ clinical and viva voce) and a minimum of 50% as aggregate in order to be declared as passed in that subject.
- In subjects that have two papers, the learner must secure minimum 40% of marks in aggregate (both papers together) to pass in theory in said subject.
- Second MBBS classes/ clinical or practical training shall not start till the results of 1st MBBS are declared. Student shall only be allowed to join 2nd MBBS if he has successfully passed in all subjects in annual/ supplementary examination of 1st MBBS.
- A candidate, who fails in the second Professional examination, shall be allowed to join the third Professional Part I training, however he shall not be allowed to appear for the examination unless he has passed second professional examination.
- A candidate who fails in the third Professional (Part I) examination shall be allowed to join third Professional part II training, however he shall not be allowed to appear for the final examination/NExT unless he has passed final first professional examination.

(d) Course duration

- Every student is required to undergo a minimum period of study extending over 4 ½ academic years, divided into four professional years (phase-1, 2, 3 & 4) from the date of commencement of MBBS course to the date of completion of examination which shall be followed by one year of compulsory rotating medical internship.
- The maximum total duration permitted to complete the MBBS course, is ten (10) years including the period of Compulsory Rotating Medical Internship (CRMI).
- Maximum permitted duration for completion of Internship is 2 years.
- No student shall be allowed more than four (04) attempts for first year (First Professional MBBS). In these four years, the maximum number of attempts permitted shall be four (4) which include supplementary examination also.
- If a candidate fails to qualify/complete the course / internship in prescribed time limit, he shall not be allowed to continue the MBBS Course under any circumstances.

My anti-ragging shield

○ What constitutes ragging

Ragging shall mean any disorderly conduct, whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating or handling with rudeness any other student, indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in a fresher or a junior student or asking the students to do any act or perform something which such student will not in the ordinary course and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of a fresher or a junior student.

○ **Actions that may constitute ragging;**

The following actions shall be included but not limited to those that may constitute ragging, namely:

(a) any conduct by any student or students whether by words spoken or written or by an act which has the effect of teasing, treating, or handling with rudeness a fresher or any other student;

(b) indulging in rowdy or undisciplined activities by any student or students which causes or is likely to cause annoyance, hardship, physical or psychological harm or to raise fear or apprehension thereof in any fresher or any other student;

(c) asking any student to do any act which such the student will not in the ordinary course do and which has the effect of causing or generating a sense of shame, or torment or embarrassment so as to adversely affect the physique or psyche of such fresher or any other student;

(d) any act by a senior student that prevents, disrupts or disturbs the regular academic activity of any other student or a fresher;

(e) exploiting the services of a fresher or any other student for completing the academic tasks assigned to an individual or a group of students;

(f) any act of financial extortion or forceful expenditure burden put on a fresher or any other student by students;

(g) any act of physical abuse including all variants of it, such as, sexual abuse, homosexual assaults stripping, forcing obscene and lewd acts, gestures, causing bodily harm or any other danger to health or person;

(h) any act or abuse by spoken words, emails, post, snail-mails, blogs, public insults which would also include deriving perverted pleasure, vicarious or sadistic thrill from actively or passively participating in the discomfiture to fresher or any other student;

(i) any act of physical or mental abuse (including bullying and exclusion) targeted at another student (fresher or otherwise) on the ground of colour, race, religion, caste, ethnicity, gender (including transgender), sexual orientation, appearance, nationality, regional origins, linguistic identity, place of birth, place of residence or economic background;

(j) any act that undermines human dignity and respect through humiliation or otherwise;

- (k) any act that affects the mental health and self-confidence of a fresher or any other student with or without an intent to derive a sadistic pleasure or showing off power, authority or superiority by a student over any fresher or any other student;
- (l) any other act not explicitly mentioned above but otherwise construed as an act of ragging in the letter and spirit of the definition for ragging as provided under regulations.

○ **What is the punishment for ragging;**

The nature of punitive actions that may be decided shall include the following, but shall not be limited to one or more of these actions that may be imposed, as deemed fit, namely:—

- (i) suspension from attending classes and academic privileges;
- (ii) withholding or withdrawing scholarship or fellowship and other benefits;
- (iii) debarring from appearing in any test or examination or other evaluation process;
- (iv) withholding results;
- (v) debarring from attending conferences, and other academic programmes;
- (vi) debarring from representing the institution in any regional, national, or international meet, tournament, youth festival, etc. ;
- (vii) suspension or expulsion from the hostel;
- (viii) imposition of a fine ranging from twenty-five thousand rupees to one lakh rupees;
- (ix) cancellation of admission;
- (x) rustication from the medical college or institution for a period ranging from one to four semesters;
- (xi) expulsion from the medical colleges or institutions and consequent debarring from admission to any other institution for a specified period.

8. Immorality shall not emerge even in my thoughts.
9. My dressing shall be decent yet impressive and inspiring confidence.
10. My conduct shall always be appropriate, pleasant, truthful, beneficial, and polite.
11. I shall use my experience in actions appropriate for that time and place.
12. I shall constantly endeavor to accomplish/keep updated with the latest developments in the field and widen my knowledge.
13. I shall treat patient of gender other than mine in presence of relatives or attendants.
14. When examining a patient, my discretion, attention, and senses shall be concentrated on the cure of the disease.
15. I shall not divulge the confidentiality related to the patient or family inappropriately.
16. Although an authority (in my subject), I shall not display my knowledge and skill with arrogance.
